

## Preface

The Asian Universities Alliance (AUA), comprising fifteen member universities, celebrated its fifth anniversary in 2022. This report showcases the work of AUA from April 2022 to April 2023 as it continued its efforts to jointly address regional and global challenges, specifically related to higher education and economic, scientific, and technological development, by strengthening collaboration among member institutions across Asia.

To celebrate its 5th anniversary, AUA held multiple events and organized various programs with member universities to reflect on past achievements. In March 2022, Tsinghua University hosted the AUA Presidents Forum, which comprised four sessions and a plenary session. With the theme of "Embracing Asian Diversity for a Shared Future: Mission of Universities in Fostering a Community of Life for People and Nature," university leaders shared diverse experiences highlighting sustainable solutions that drive the progress and innovation of higher education in Asia and beyond.

In 2022-2023, AUA Executive Presidency was held by the United Arab Emirates University, with Professor Ghaleb Ali AlHadrami AlBreiki serving as AUA Executive President. In November 2022, AUA Executives' Meeting took place in Al Ain, United Arab Emirates, which emphasized the preparedness of member universities to forge ahead with new initiatives. AUA Youth Forum—Uniting for a Sustainable Future: Asian Youth in Action, hosted by United Arab Emirates University, is an excellent example of how AUA inspires young people to contribute to sustainable development locally and globally.

This year marks the completion of the AUA Framework 2020-2023. Throughout these years, in light of the COVID-19 pandemic, AUA showed solidarity, resilience, and tenacity. Throughout the year, AUA has continued promoting educational resource sharing and the development of a multicultural learning environment. Between June 2022 and May 2023, AUA member universities actively proposed and hosted various student mobility programs in disciplines related to AUA themes: Artificial Intelligence and Data Science, Asian Civilizations, and Energy and Sustainability. Altogether, 415 students participated in 8 student programs hosted by five member universities and the AUA Secretariat.

Recent global events, such as the COVID-19 pandemic, have further emphasized the need for resilience in the face of unexpected disruption. Universities face several challenges, including sustainable development and the need to adapt to new technologies. Such challenges require a collaborative approach. AUA member universities have actively worked together to leverage their resources and expertise. AUA Lecture Series 2022: Future of Energy drew from the best educational resources of our members and invited

16 eminent scholars from 14 universities to provide diverse approaches to sustainable, clean, and affordable energy. Through live broadcast sessions of the Online Education Fair 2022, which attracted thousands of viewers, AUA member universities provided detailed information about international students' recruitment.

By organizing academic conferences, AUA provides a platform for international exchanges to facilitate research collaboration. From 2022 to 2023, AUA member universities hosted six academic conferences on various topics such as public health resilience, water technology, graph theory and combinatorics, management research, and Asian civilizations. Engaging a total of 271 participants from fifteen member universities, these conferences offered a unique opportunity for scholars, students, and researchers to share their research findings, network with experts in the field, and enhance their skills. Participants learned about the latest research trends and broadened their perspectives, which allowed them to pursue further research.

AUA plays a crucial role in fostering communication on university strategy and policy by organizing university administration meetings. Such meetings build towards bilateral cooperation agreements between member universities. In February 2023, Universiti Malaya organized a program on the Establishment of AUA Institutions Joint/Dual Postgraduate Academic Programs, which allowed delegates to share best practices and discuss prospects about joint and dual degree programs.

Higher education has always been a dynamic sector. Over the past few years, member universities have adapted to major transformations in the sector with a pragmatic approach that has created a stronger Alliance. In the face of adversity, AUA has developed a series of working policies, mechanisms, and practices and formed a joint force through unity and collaboration. By pooling and sharing quality educational resources, AUA members have jointly organized a set of activities that instilled a sense of community into scholars and students.

As humankind, we face shared challenges such as climate change, food security, and environmental pollution. Looking upon past experiences, universities need to rethink how to tackle these issues and adapt to the new realities in the higher education sector. Each member university should prioritize win-win synergies to thrive and accelerate growth globally over the next decade. AUA is a good example of universities working together to build a community of Asian higher education for a shared future. Combining strengths in research, education, and innovation, the AUA member universities will ensure progress toward that goal.

### **Artificial Intelligence & Data Science**



### **AUA Youth Forum**

The AUA Youth Forum (AUAYF) is developed to be a flagship program organized by the Executive Presidency every year. In line with the mission of AUA, the AUAYF is dedicated to addressing developmental issues in the region, enhancing youth empowerment, and promoting cultural and academic exchanges among the AUA students. It aims to promote a vision of sustainability, innovativeness and collaboration through joint activities in a way that encourages the collective sharing of knowledge and the founding of multinational friendships. Each AUAYF focuses on a specific topic and theme drawn from the AUA Framework.

### **AUA Lecture Series**

AUA Lecture Series is an academic program that brings together scholars from multiple AUA member universities to jointly deliver a series of academic lectures on a specific topic related to Asia, e.g., Asia's economies, new energy industry, sustainable development, etc. AUA Lecture Series is a unique public education product developed by AUA as it provides students with different facts, views, and perspectives on the same issue by scholars from different parts of Asia.

### **Overseas Study Programs**

Overseas Study Programs (OSP) bring together students of similar academic interests to attend an intensive short-term course. The programs aim to broaden students' knowledge about a subject, raise their awareness and help students gain valuable insights through the exchange of academic ideas with peers and professors of different nationalities.

### **Arts and Sports Events**

Many AUA member universities have vibrant arts and sports communities. Artistic and sports education constitute an important part of university education as well as campus life. *Arts and Sports Events (ASE)* allow students to showcase their talents and share cross-cultural experiences with one another. Through artistic endeavors and sportsmanship, these programs help students grow into creative and independent thinkers.

# **AUA Youth Forum**

### Building a Meta Silk Road: Integration of Asian Cultures in the Real and Virtual Universe

From October 24 to 28, 2022, the Asian Universities Alliance Youth Forum under the theme of "Building a Meta Silk Road: Integration of Asian Cultures in the Real and Virtual Universe", was hosted by Nazarbayev University (NU) in Astana, Kazakhstan.

The AUA Youth Forum (AUAYF) focused on particular themes—such as Artificial Intelligence & Data Science, Public Health, Asian Civilizations, and Future Habitats—that correspond to the concept of the AUA year.

At the Youth Forum, about 40 participants represented 8 AUA member universities: Nazarbayev University, The University of Tokyo, Chulalongkorn University, Indian Institute of Technology Bombay, United Arab Emirates University, The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, Seoul National University, Universiti Malaya, and the University of Colombo (online).

On October 24, the Forum opened with welcoming remarks by NU President Shigeo Katsu and Provost Ilesanmi Adesida. Dr. Loretta O'Donnell, NU Vice Provost for Academic Affairs, delivered her speech on *Heritage and Silk Road*, and Ms. Aliya Kaimoldinova, Head of the Office of Global Relations, gave a talk on *Internationalization*.

Katsu mentioned the increasing role of digital technologies and the historical connection between Silk Road countries and emphasized the importance of communication between people and the value of cultural exchange.

Artificial Intelligence and Smart Systems have become the infrastructure of life; this Forum will examine their intersection with the areas of business, finance, and environment and their impact on culture in the heart of the Ancient Silk Road," said NU Provost Ilesanmi Adesida.

During the week, students from AUA member universities exchanged knowledge, experiences, and cultural values. The Youth Forum program included workshops by NU professors on the following topics as research in AI, AR/XR/VR, data science, and computer graphics; AI in Environmental Health; Cyber Security and Blockchain; "Data as the new oil: Alibaba's multi-billion business model building on data analytics"; "Preserving Silk Roads Heritage: Challenges and Solutions". In addition, participants had a chance to attend scientific workshops and seminars and visited the National Park–Borovoe resort area where they learned about Kazakh cultural heritage.

On the closing day, students wore their national costumes, shared a piece of their culture with creative performances, and reflected on what they had learned about Kazakhstan.

AUA Lecture Series 2022: Future of Energy was held online from October to December 2022. Sixteen eminent scholars from 14 AUA universities delivered lectures tailored for AUA students. attracting more than 100,000 audiences online.

The theme of AUA Lecture Series 2022 was related to Sustainable Development Goal 7: Affordable and Clean Energy. Energy is an important material basis and driving force for the progress of human civilization. The UN states that sustainable energy "transforms lives, economies and the planet" and that access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and clean energy is critical to achieving many of the SDGs, especially mitigating climate change. In reaching the targets for Goal 7, Asian countries developed their national energy strategies and energy policies based on domestic energy demand and the international energy situation. Asia has abundant and promising clean energy resources, which is an important foundation for achieving a clean, diversified, reliable and economical supply of energy in the future.

AUA Lecture Series 2022: Future of Energy invited experts from each AUA university who introduced the energy strategies of their home countries, including scenario planning, and guided students and other attendees to rethink how to "ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy for all."

Both the AUA students and the global audience gained a good level of understanding of energy strategies and policies across Asia. In addition, the AUA students enrolled in the program had an opportunity to learn from and have discussions with other students from Asia.





BUTTLE BOTTO Progress of Research on lew Energy Power Systems






















### **AUA-IITB Overseas Study Program 2021 Artificial Intelligence in Education**

The AUA Overseas Study Program "Artificial Intelligence in Education (AIED)" was hosted online by IIT Bombay from 23rd May 2022 to 3rd June 2022. The 10-day long program was designed to introduce the learners to the application of artificial intelligence in one of the most promising domains today—Education. The course was uniquely designed to give the students an experience of what prospects and challenges may arise from data generated by learners in a variety of educational setups, and what novel technologies are available today to address such hurdles.

A diverse set of 23 student participants from ten universities across Asia took part in the program: the University of Yangon, National University of Singapore, Peking University, Tsinghua University, the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, Chulalongkorn University, Nazarbayev University, Seoul National University, Universitas Indonesia, and Indian Institute of Technology Bombay.

During the program, the students were taken through a curated set of asynchronous video lectures delivered by the instructor of the course, which were accompanied by daily live online interactions with the instructor and TAs. Some of the topics covered included introduction to machine learning, introduction to Python programming, different levels of analytics, data privacy, data visualization, machine learning, descriptive analytics, diagnostic analytics, pattern and process mining, and multimodal learning analytics. The students were introduced to a publicly available dataset called Open University Learning Analytics Dataset (OULAD), which contains data about seven courses, students, and their interactions with a digital learning environment. The last two days of the program were focused on the course project and presentations by the groups.

Based on the experience and feedback of the participants, the program was well-received and reflected the AUA's objectives of inculcating scientific temper in higher education students through a multi-cultural learning environment and promoting cultural exchanges among the students.




### **AUA-IITB Overseas Study Program** 2022-Freight Transportation Planning and Logistics


The AUA Overseas Study Program "Freight Transportation Planning and Logistics" was hosted online by Indian Institute of Technology Bombay (IITB) on 4-15 July 2022. 10 students from 5 AUA universities participated in this online program.

The program aimed to encourage students better understand the modeling and planning technologies of freight movement. Unlike passenger movement, there are many players involved in the decision-making of freight movement. It is important to understand, model, and plan the logistics of these movements. Efficient logistics operations are vital for the economic prosperity of a region. Many countries have higher logistics costs causing hurdles in freight mobility. With the exponential growth in e-commerce, the significance of logistics operations has only increased.

Throughout a series of lectures, course tutorials and presentations, students had an opportunity to explore various key topics in freight transportation planning and logistics operations.

### AUA-NU Overseas Study Program 2022 - Water Resources Policy and Management

The AUA Overseas Study Program "Water Resources Policy and Management" was held online by Nazarbayev University from 5 October to 7 December 2022.

The program aimed to accentuate the role of water resources policy and management by focusing on the Central Asia region with a comparative analysis of South/Southeast Asia regions.

A total of 23 students from 11 AUA universities participated in this online program. Participants had an opportunity to understand the concept of integrated water resources management (IWRM) through an interdisciplinary approach; to apply holistic conceptual frameworks for the development of better water resources management and policy decisions; and to interpret the complexities of transboundary water systems into policy frameworks.





The AUA-HKUST FinTech MasterClass was held from 28 October to 10 December 2022. The program consisted of Hong Kong FinTech Week, Distinguish talks and HKUST Web3 Carnival.

AUA participants received the student passes to join the main conference of Hong Kong FinTech Week virtually and had a chance to connect with professionals from different countries. Over 250 top speakers around the world, including FinTech founders, investors, regulators, and academics, shared their views and experience in their respective fields.

### **AUA Biodiversity Photography Contest**

The AUA Biodiversity Photo Contest took place between January and April 2022. Ninety students, faculty members, and staff from twelve AUA member universities submitted over 500 photographs. The contest was part of a number of events discussing critical global and regional challenges for AUA's 5th anniversary.

The theme of the contest was "Community of Life: Biodiversity Through the Lens." It was hosted by the Asian Universities Alliance (AUA) Secretariat and organized by Tsinghua Shenzhen International Graduate School (Tsinghua SIGS).

Photographs submitted to the contest highlighted unique species, the intersection of biodiversity and modern life, and the coexistence between human beings and nature. In each of the two categories, smartphone and digital camera, six winners were chosen: one first prize winner, two second prize winners, and three third prize winners. The first prize photos, along with second and third prize photos were exhibited online on the AUA 5th Anniversary website and in an offline exhibition in Shenzhen organized by Tsinghua SIGS. A number of shortlisted photos were also displayed at the exhibition and in the contest photo album.

The photo contest and exhibition come at a time when biodiversity is being discussed on a global scale. In 2019, the UN published a report on global biodiversity and ecosystems that drew attention to the severe impact of human actions on animal and plant habitats. As a result, the first part of the UN Biodiversity Conference (COP 15) was held in Kunming, Yunnan, China in October 2021. At the event, delegates were committed to negotiating a post-2020 global biodiversity framework. The "Community of Life: Biodiversity Through the Lens" Photo Contest is part of this global effort to bring attention to the critical issue of biodiversity.

As a vivid and creative reflection of this global effort, the winning photographs have brought awareness to the importance of biodiversity protection in the AUA community and beyond.

AUA Academic Conference on Learning in a Post-Covid-19 Era was held on June 16-17, 2022. By organizing this academic conference, Chulalongkorn University aimed to connect common concerns, insights and aspirations shared by leading scholars and practitioners in AUA member institutions and other stakeholders in society, to seek a new learning that would serve Asia. ### 2022 AUA Academic Conference on the Exchange of Asian Civilisations and the Smooth Flow of Trade along the Countries of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) in conjunction with 2022 Tsinghua Symposium Seminar

On August 28th, 2022, AUA Academic Conference in conjunction with Tsinghua Symposium Seminar was successfully held at Hunan University. Under the theme of "The Exchange of Asian Civilizations and the Smooth Flow of Trade Along the Countries of the Belt and Road Initiative", experts and scholars emphasized the significance of promoting shared identity and values, working hand in hand toward improving Asian higher education and its tangible impact on society's biggest challenges.

The conference was held in a hybrid format, co-hosted by Tsinghua University and Hunan University. It included three-panel discussions, attended by 39 scholars representing 35 universities and 12 countries.

The AUA Academic conference began with the opening ceremony, chaired by Prof. Hou Junjun, Dean of the School of Economics and Trade, Hunan University. Prof. Wang Weibin, Vice President of Hunan University, delivered the welcoming remarks. Following this, Dr. Zhang Chuanjie, AUA Secretary, pointed to the importance of exchanges among Asian civilizations. He encouraged scholars from different countries and universities to strengthen dialogue, embrace diversity and deepen mutual understanding.

Following the opening ceremony, invited experts delivered keynote speeches addressing current socio-economic issues within Asia. Prof. Sawada Yasuyuki, who served as the Chief Economist of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and is now a professor at the Faculty of Economics at the University of Tokyo, gave a speech on "Imitation, Innovation, and Digitalization in Post-COVID Asian Development." According to Prof. Yasuyuki, the driving policy of Asian technological transformation should be analyzed through historical narratives of technological development in Asia as well as Japan's "flying geese paradigm."

Prof. Fu Yuming from the Business School at the National University of Singapore gave a speech entitled "Urban Development in the Context of Decarbonization and Digitalization." He stressed that the development of low-carbon cities in response to climate change should continue by improving the national happiness index. Prof. Xu Helian, who serves as the Secretary-General of the China-Africa Economic and Trade Research Institute at Hunan University, delivered a speech entitled "Structural Characteristics and Reconstruction of the Trade Relations Network of Countries along "the Belt and Road." He

demonstrated the network structure of the BRI countries and their supply chain characteristics through space-time performance using geographical computing. Prof. Tang Xiaoyang, Dean of the Department of International Relations at Tsinghua University, delivered his keynote speech on the topic "Asian Regional Integration Process Under the Trend of Counter-globalization." He provided an excellent blueprint for regional cooperation in Asia by considering the historical context of globalization.

In the first panel discussion, entitled "The Belt and Road Initiative and Civilizational Exchange and Mutual Appreciation", 13 scholars presented their research results and proposed a set of policy formulations. They provided an overview of the countries and regions along the Belt and Road and mainly focused on the following topics: maritime Silk Road, peacekeeping, and digitalization.

During the second panel discussion, 12 speakers elaborated on the major role of the Belt and Road initiative as well as the impact of international cooperation on development. Under the theme of "Economic and Social Impact of the Belt and Road Initiative", scholars also proposed a set of technical strategies to advance the BRI initiative based on quantitative economic modeling.

Prior to the closing ceremony, the third-panel discussion entitled "Inclusive Growth and Digital Transformation in Asia" took place. Its participants discussed how China, Japan, Indonesia, Vietnam, and Sri Lanka among other Belt and Road countries in Asia had improved their socio-economic development through a technological transformation as well as education-driven and innovative thinking. Speakers argued that focusing on the topics such as green finance, digital media, and talent cultivation is the key to achieving success in the process of modernization.

At the closing ceremony, Prof. Ai Hongshan delivered a concluding speech. Each session during panel discussions was chaired by respected professors from Tsinghua University and Hunan University.

Overall, this academic conference was a success as it will certainly help further strengthen the collaboration among Asian universities, enhance cultural exchanges, and promote trade along the countries of the Belt and Road initiative. Participants agreed on the significance of sharing knowledge among civilizations and improving people-to-people exchanges to build a better future for all.

### 10th Asian Management Research and Case Conference 2022 in Collaboration with Asian Universities Alliance

The Covid-19 outbreak has challenged every aspect of management, forcing stakeholders to adapt and evolve amid increasing uncertainties. The impacts of the pandemic have been starkly different for developing nations; yet the rapid adoption of technology to prop up segments of business and industry presents a unique disruption that promises endless possibilities for growth, driving employment, increasing productivity, impacting global health and education, and transforming supply chains beyond borders. From October 4th to October 6th, under the theme of "Building Resilience in an Increasingly Turbulent World: Evolving Managerial Perspectives", the 10th Asian Management Research and Case Conference (AMRC) in Collaboration with the Asian Universities Alliance (AUA) was successfully held at the United Arab Emirates University (UAEU) in Al Ain, UAE.

AMRC Conference aimed to explore the intersection of business and society in the context of building and enhancing resilience to overcome emerging challenges. It was organized by the College of Business and Economics at United Arab Emirates University (UAEU), Lahore University of Management Sciences (LUMS), IIM Bangalore, and the University of Dhaka in collaboration with the Asian Universities Alliance (AUA). Research papers and teaching cases mainly addressed the issues that were related to the conference sub-themes: Accounting & Finance, Managerial Economics, Corporate Social Responsibility, Entrepreneurship, Marketing, Human Resource Management, International Business, Organizational Behavior, Technology & Operational Management, and Leadership.

On Oct 4th, the conference began with the keynote address delivered by Prof. Dima Rachid Jamali, Dean & Professor of Business Administration from the University of Sharjah. During

In the afternoon, two keynote speeches were delivered by Prof. Alnoor (LUMS) and Prof. Michael Holmes (Florida State University). Also, the three parallel paper presentation sessions took place focusing on Human Resource Management, Managerial Economics, and Production & Operations Management.

The 3rd day of the conference started with keynote speeches delivered by guest speakers: Prof. Maunther Barakat from New York University Abu Dhabi; Prof. Maura Scott from Florida State University. They provided insights on financial markets in times of crises and how can marketing research advance individual, societal and environmental well-being. Following this, four parallel sessions took place exploring the following research areas: Business & Management, Marketing & Entrepreneurship, Economics, and Organizational Behavior.

Participants of the AMRC Conference 2022 included representatives from several AUA member universities: University of Colombo, Universitas Indonesia, Nazarbayev University, Tsinghua University, United Arab Emirates University, Indian Institute of Technology Bombay, The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology.

Overall, the conference was a great success. Participants concluded that being resilient is the key to adapting to a new normal. Resilience helps communities transform traditions to keep each other safe, and businesses learn to grow in the face of turbulent conditions.

Research papers, presentations, and plenary sessions addressed the needs through scientific discussions by exploring the following sub-themes: Nanomaterials for Water Purification, Biophysical Separation & Remediation, Photocatalysis for Water Treatment, Membranes, Physio-chemical & Thermal Processes, Oil Water Separation, Challenges in Water Purification & Desalination and Sensors.


The conference commenced with an inaugural session. The welcome address was made by Prof. Shobha Shukla, Professor MEMS and Professor-in-charge of water center WICTRE at IIT Bombay, India. This was followed by opening remarks delivered by Prof. S. Sudarshan, Deputy Director of Indian Institute of Technology Bombay. The abstract book was released and the audience was addressed by Prof. S. Manoharan, Director General, PDPU Gandhinagar, India. This was followed by an address by Mr. Unnikrishnan, CEO of IITB Monash research academy, IIT Bombay, Prof. K. Kaliappan, Dean Strategy and Prof. N. N. Vishwanathan, HOD MEMS, IIT Bombay. An overview of WICTRE collaboration was provided by Prof. Sumit Saxena, Professor MEMS, IIT Bombay, India. The inaugural session ended with an overview of Indian Desalination Association and Board of Research in Nuclear Sciences provided by their representatives.

The Inaugural session was followed by a technical session. The technical session consisted of plenary, invited, contributory talks, panel discussion, networking lunch and dinner, and workshop along with a poster session on both days. The participants not only learned about the latest technological advancements and innovations in water technology through each of these activities but also were able to connect to experts and peers in the field.

### 2023 AUA Academic Conference on Public Health Resilience in the COVID-19 Pandemic

On 12-13 February 2023, the Faculty of Public Health Universitas Indonesia (FPH UI) as the host and the University of Tokyo as the co-host brought the theme of "Public Health Resilience in the COVID-19 Pandemic: Innovative Approach and Best Practice in Facing the Challenges." The conference included various Public Health topic areas, including Epidemiology, Occupational Health and Safety, Health Administration & Policy, Environmental Health, Health Communication, Public Health Nutrition, Biostatistics, Health Tourism, and others.

The conference consisted of three events: (1) a pre-conference seminar for graduates and postgraduate students, (2) oral and poster presentations, and (3) publication in several Scopus or SINTA-indexed journals. Participants included presenters from 9 out of 15 AUA member universities. Altogether 116 abstracts were submitted from AUA member universities and will be included in the abstract book. The full papers submitted by the participants will be published in 15 journals that have collaborated with Universitas Indonesia.

Before the opening ceremony, the Faculty of Public Health Universitas Indonesia (FPH UI) organized an event called "paper writing clinic". This pre-conference event brought highly reputable speakers that shared their expertise and experience in writing and publishing. This one-day event targeted a wide range of students at any stage of their writing.

The opening of the conference took place smoothly and was greeted happily by all conference attendees. After the opening ceremony took place, the first activity was a keynote speech by drg. Agus Suprapto, M.Kes, an Expert Staff for Human Development and Cultural Affairs of RI. He presented the topic regarding "Intersectoral Coordination Experience in Policy Implementation and Innovation to Improve Indonesian Public Health Quality". In solving the COVID-19 problem, drg. Agus Suprapto said that ministries in Indonesia are working together to form a strategy to deal with COVID-19 and succeeded in forming several policies.

In the plenary session on the first day of the conference, a guest speaker Prof. Tjandra Yoga, one of the professors at the Faculty of Medicine, Universitas Indonesia and former Director of Communicable Diseases WHO Southeast Asia presented the topic "The importance of Public Health approaches in facing global emerging diseases on secondary health care". He emphasized that the world needs to be prepared for a new pandemic that will come.

Prof. Akira Yasukouchi from Kyushu University conveyed the topic of "Introduction of physio-anthropological evaluation of human adaptability to the artificial environment".

During an online symposium that carried the topic of green hospitals and sustainability, three experts mentioned that hospitals and healthcare services need to become significantly more proactive in leading the transformation to net zero carbon emissions because the journey will also reduce the burden on hospitals and health systems.

Another activity, Symposium: Green Construction, emphasized the need for calculating carbon emissions in order to mitigate greenhouse gas emissions. In his presentation, Mr. Firansyah shared information regarding the implementation of green construction by PT. Nindya Karya, in the form of NICAF (a software for calculating carbon emissions in construction activities in the Nindya Karya).

On the 2nd day of the conference, during the Plenary Session dr. Heru Kasidi, M.Sc, (Chief of Pita Putih Indonesia) has delivered an issue about climate change and its impact on Maternal and Neonatal Health (MNH). Prof. dr. Zubairi Djoerban, Sp.PD-KHOM (Internist – Specialists of Hematology and Oncology, Universitas Indonesia) shared information about HIV/AIDS situation and management in Indonesia.

In the last plenary session, three speakers who are experts in their respective fields discussed the COVID-19 problem from various perspectives. Each speaker brought up different topics as follows:

- 1) Current Situation of Global and Indonesian Children's Malnutrition delivered by a nutrition specialist for UNICEF Indonesia, David Colozza.
- 2) Lesson Learned from COVID-19 Handling in Indonesia: Policy, Implementation, Evaluation, and Recommendations for Policy Changes or Updates based on Regional Perspective. Speaker: Prof. drh. Wiku Bakti Bawono Adisasmito (Indonesian Task Force for COVID-19 Handling)
- 3) Environmental Global Changes and Implication On Planetary Health: Control And Management Strategies. Speaker: Dr. Barlev Nico Marhehe (UNEP Indonesia)

### **AUA-UAEU** Workshop on Graph Theory, **Combinatorics and Applications**

The 2022 AUA-UAEU Workshop on Graph Theory, Combinatorics and Applications (GTCA2022) was hosted by the United Arab Emirates University in collaboration with Universitas Indonesia on 13-15 November 2022.

A total of 15 participants from 6 AUA universities participated in the workshop.

Graph theory and combinatorics are closely related to many mathematical subjects, such as topology, geometry and number theory, and have a lot of applications in applied sciences, engineering and optimization problems. The workshop focused on all aspects of graph theory, combinatorics and their applications. Organizers aimed to create a platform for exchanging the latest research results and ideas, to share the advanced research methods and latest trends in these areas, and to develop further collaborations.



AUA-UAEU Workshop (GTCA 2022) AUA provides opportunities for the member universities to discuss strategies, policies and administrative practices. Besides holding the AUA Presidents Forum (AUAPF) annually during which university strategies are presented and discussed, AUA also hosts University Administration Meetings, which mainly focus on the sharing of policies and administrative practices.

### Session 1 University Internationalization During and After COVID-19

This year's AUAPF, themed "Embracing Asian Diversity for a Shared Future: Mission of Universities in Fostering a Community of Life for People and Nature", explores the scope of advancement in higher education amidst new and profound challenges.

On March 15th, the Asian Universities Alliance Presidents Forum 2022 (AUAPF 2022) kicked off the first session themed "University Internationalization During and After COVID-19". It brought to the forefront critical challenges the pandemic poses to higher education and innovative strategies to move forward. Prof. Kaori Hayashi, Executive Vice President of the University of Tokyo; Prof. Yang Bin, Provost and Vice President of Tsinghua University; and Dr. Reuben Wong, Associate Vice President of the National University of Singapore attended the session, which was moderated by Dr. Zhang Chuanjie, Secretary of Asian Universities Alliance.

As a locus of knowledge creation and dissemination, universities have a critical role to play in leading joint efforts in tackling a new range of challenges. In this spirit, AUAPF 2022, themed "Embracing Asian Diversity for a Shared Future: Mission of Universities in Fostering a Community of Life for People and Nature", brings together university leaders from across Asia to explore new approaches and opportunities in higher education.

In his opening remarks, Dr. Zhang Chuanjie highlighted the importance of exchanging best practices among AUA member universities, and the significance of ensuring that higher education remains open, accessible and dynamic in the face of new challenges.

The panelists shared their universities' practices and experiences in navigating the COVID-19 crisis, including the shift to hybrid and online classes, and the importance of unwavering commitment to internationalization during and after the pandemic.

Prof. Kaori Hayashi introduced the University of Tokyo's various initiatives to overcome difficulties posed by the pandemic, including the "Global Unit Courses" program which attracted 88 participants from 17 countries. She also talked about the University of Tokyo's online "Short Term Education Programs", which has received very positive feedback from students and has made education more accessible. For continued academic exchange, the University of Tokyo also implemented the "Global Fellow Designation Program," which invited scholars from overseas to participate remotely in research and education practices.

Dr. Reuben Wong shared the experience of hosting the first online "Young Asian Leaders Initiative" for Singaporean and Southeast Asian students. "This was a fantastic way of connecting youth across borders," according to Wong. Technology provides a unique opportunity for students from all kinds of financial backgrounds to participate and connect on an equal footing. To document virtual learning, the National University of Singapore has encouraged students and faculty to produce online content, such as making videos and blogs. Wong also emphasized the importance of fostering global citizens through interdisciplinarity.

In his remarks, Prof. Yang Bin pointed out that despite the challenges, the pandemic has also brought a transformation in digital education for Tsinghua University. Many international students who are unable to come to campus and the hundreds of volunteers serving the Winter Olympics are now taking hybrid classes, and learning alongside their classmates who are physically in the classroom. Yang pointed out that the pandemic has highlighted the importance and urgency of joint efforts in addressing global challenges. To this end, Tsinghua will put more emphasis on international exchange and cooperation in four particular areas: public health, climate change, online education and artificial intelligence governance.

The panelists also addressed questions from the audience on topics including the quality of online courses and career education during the pandemic. Bringing diverse viewpoints to the session, panelists engaged in a lively discussion and exchanged best practices among member universities. Their valuable contributions embodied the resilience and shared commitment to internationalization at the universities.

### Session 2 Creating a University Culture of Innovation and Lifelong Learning

On 17 March 2022, AUA members convened for the second session of the Asian Universities Alliance Presidents Forum (AUAPF) 2022.

The second session, "Creating a University Culture of Innovation and Lifelong Learning", engaged Prof. Bundhit Eua-arporn, President of Chulalongkorn University; Prof. OH Se-Jung, President of Seoul National University; and Prof. Mohd. Hamdi Abd. Shukor, Vice-Chancellor of Universiti Malaya. Dr. Loretta O'Donell, Vice-Provost of Nazarbayev University, moderated the session.

In a candid discussion, panelists deliberated the role and responsibility of universities in enabling a sustainable future for all, by cultivating lifelong learners and driving innovative solutions to common challenges. On the question of fostering a culture of innovation, President Bundhit discussed how the Chulalongkorn University Innovation Hub, since its launch in 2016, has created spinoff innovation enterprises, commercialized products at a faster rate, and changed the way projects are incubated and funded. The hub has incubated over 300 startups, benefiting over 2 million people and reaching over 52 provinces in Thailand.

President Oh discussed how the Artificial Intelligence Institute of Seoul National University, since its establishment in 2019, has boosted joint research among different disciplines and promoted collaboration between industrial and academic sectors. Additionally, SNU has embarked on an ambitious "2031 Initiative" aimed at significantly reorganizing the existing curriculum and education system into a more student-oriented one, where interdisciplinary studies are the norm rather than the exception.

For Universiti Malaya, the culture of research has transformed over the last 10 to 15 years from a primary focus on producing papers in high-impact journals towards creating a more tangible impact. Vice Chancellor Hamdi believes that the university must strive

to create more visible outcomes for society at large, including contributions to global SDGs and ESGs. To that end, UM is also allocating more efforts to promoting multidisciplinary research.

"Lifelong learning is the key to developing global citizens", according to President Bundhit. The panelists all agreed that creating a culture of lifelong learning is essential to adapting to and solving global challenges. In an effort to overcome the challenges of long-distance learning brought by the pandemic, their universities have developed various online education programs. These include SNU's Extension College, Center for Teaching and Learning, and Academy of University Administration, Universiti Malaya's Centre for Continuing Education, and Chulalongkorn's CU Neuron, CUVIP and Degree Plus.

While the panelists acknowledged the pandemic poses new challenges to innovation and lifelong learning, it has also brought many opportunities. According to President Oh, SNU created an integrated knowledge hub that shared the latest updates and research about the pandemic with the public. SNU also launched online international summer programs which were well received by many students.

President Bundhit added that the pandemic has indeed accelerated lifelong learning, with a larger number of learners engaging in the online learning system. In terms of innovation, the research of Chulalongkorn University in the last two years was more oriented towards providing practical solutions related to COVID-19 challenges.

In Universiti Malaya, despite COVID-related lockdowns and the temporary closure of the campus and labs, researchers managed to adapt to the challenges and continued their innovation effort. Vice Chancellor Hamdi also shared UM's hybrid full-degree programs, which have enabled many international and adult learners to pursue their academic aspirations. Consequently, the capacity of these programs has also increased.

The session also addressed the need to adapt to the "mobile phone era", ways to incentivize faculty members to contribute to lifelong learning, and content development for more engaging education programs. The insightful responses and wisdom shared by the panelists serve as a testament to lifelong learning in action, which many can learn from.

Previously, on 15 March, the first session of AUAPF 2022 explored "University Internationalization During and After COVID-19" with panelists from the University of Tokyo, Tsinghua University, and the National University of Singapore.

### Session 3 Future of Learning: Interdisciplinary

Why is interdisciplinarity the emerging and desirable trend in higher education? What strategies are Asia's leading universities exploring to promote interdisciplinarity? How can the 'future of learning' meet the new demands of the rapidly evolving society?

**Education and Innovative Pedagogy** 

These were some of the critical questions examined in the third session themed "Future of Learning: Interdisciplinary Education and Innovative Pedagogy". The panel included Prof. Lionel Ni, President of The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology (Guangzhou); Prof. Chandrika Wijeyaratne, Vice Chancellor of the University of Colombo; and Dr. Loretta O'Donnell, Vice Provost of Nazarbayev University. Prof. Yong Zulina Zubairi, Associate Vice-Chancellor of Universiti Malaya, moderated the session.

In her opening remarks, Prof. Zubairi noted that the complex and multifaceted nature of emerging challenges warrants the need for imaginative solutions. "Universities thus have a vital role to play as we seek effective solutions," she said. "Transcending disciplinary boundaries and incorporating multiple perspectives can take us a long way." The panel discussion that followed assessed the strategies as well as challenges universities face in their quest to promote interdisciplinary education and innovative pedagogy.

### **Creating Synergy**

For universities to strike a balance between "theory and practice" as well as "depth and breadth" is as crucial as it is challenging. Interdisciplinary education needs to be geared towards bridging these gaps through innovative curriculum development and engaging real-world problem-solving. According to Dr. O'Donnell, "When we think about interdisciplinarity in terms of education, we essentially think of the word synthesis," so the question that needs to be asked is, "How do we look at a range of different mental models and synthesize them to come up with complex answers to the complex questions." Consequently, Nazarbayev University (NU) strives to build on the concept of the "T-shaped student", who possesses knowledge spread across a range of disciplines, but also holds depth in a certain specialization. This approach is meant to equip graduates with the ability to solve problems from a range of different perspectives. NU's compulsory core curriculum that includes ethics, writing and history is designed to achieve exactly this.

O'Donnell also reflected on the dichotomy between successful academic careers, that incentivize scholars to specialize in a very narrow field, and the complex thinking skills required to tackle practical challenges such as climate change, gender equality, public health and issues of well-being. By allocating collaborative research grants, NU is encouraging scholars to pursue multi-disciplinary studies. As a national university, NU's mandate also includes crossinstitutional collaborations with other universities in Kazakhstan.

O'Donnell emphasized that a collaborative culture "is a step forward to many things, from solving a particular research problem, towards creating more harmony and more understanding across cultures."

### **Pushing Boundaries**

On "budgets and boundaries", President Ni of The Hong Kong

University of Science and Technology (Guangzhou) (HKUST(GZ)) offered a candid assessment. "Whereas all higher education practitioners know the importance and benefits of collaborations. when you come down to budget allocation and performance assessment, boundaries come into play," he said. He explained that the establishment of HKUST (GZ) creates an exceptional opportunity for new resources, organizational structure and physical settings needed for the systematic development of cross-disciplinary programs in concert with the disciplinary-oriented efforts at HKUST's Clear Water Bay campus. At HKUST (GZ), cross-disciplinary education and research will be realized through four "hubs", namely, function hub, information hub, systems hub, and society hub. The university encourages theme-based labs which are accessible to all the interested faculty and students. Ni also firmly advocated randomlyallocated and multidisciplinary spaces for faculty members, "I don't say this department or that department. The person next door may be from a different discipline, which allows them to communicate."

Promoting innovation through interdisciplinary work is key to education at HKUST (GZ). Ni noted, "We encourage students to learn from different disciplines. Graduate students, especially PhD students, need dual advisors from different disciplines." Commenting on the impact of COVID-19 on education, he asserted that by forcing universities out of their comfort zones, the pandemic has offered a unique opportunity. "We had no choice; we stuck on to further improve, to a point where I think we're effective now," he remarked while describing the speed with which online teaching was eventually embraced. Despite initial reluctance and skepticism from faculty and students, "our evaluation of online classes is better than the traditional classroom," he noted. Ni also stressed that ultimately a mindset-change is very important to "making a change, and making an impact."

### **Towards Problem-Solving**

While assessing the system of exam-based learning in many Asian societies, Vice Chancellor Wijeyaratne noted that this culture needs to change. To shift away from traditional learning methods and encourage "out of the box" thinking, the University of Colombo (UoC) has established staff development centres and young academic mentoring initiatives. "We reviewed this situation because we had a little more time during this pandemic," she discussed, further elaborating that a "new reality" has opened the eyes of young professionals to new opportunities, with more focus on real-world challenges. UoC has responded by expediting education in more practical sectors, increasing emphasis on emerging fields such as entrepreneurship, and establishing better connections between job providers and the university.

According to Wijeyaratne, "The goal for universities should move beyond 'simply teaching or learning' and instead include practical application, and to equip students with enough flexibility to change their course over time in order to achieve richer career outcomes." UoC has encouraged different competitions and created new avenues to inspire students and faculty members to connect with the real world and evolving trends in the job market.

All panelists agreed that today universities find themselves on a fast track to think about academia differently and more holistically. In this light, Asian universities have a unique opportunity to transcend disciplinary boundaries and incorporate multiple perspectives in finding viable and imaginative solutions for a better world.

### Session 4 The Networked University for an **Integrated Education and Research Ecosystem**

On 25 March 2022. AUA members convened for the fourth session of the Asian Universities Alliance Presidents Forum (AUAPF) 2022. With the theme of "The Networked University for an Integrated Education and Research Ecosystem", the session brought together Prof. Ghaleb Al Hadrami AlBreiki, Acting Vice-Chancellor of the United Arab Emirates University; Prof. Subhasis Chaudhuri, Director of the Indian Institute of Technology Bombay; Dr. Agustin Kusumayati, University Secretary of Universitas Indonesia; and Prof. Tin Maung Tun, Rector of the University of Yangon. Prof. King Chow, Acting Dean of Students of The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, moderated the

Panelists openly shared their initiatives and experiences in creating an environment for integrated education and research through the optimization of institutional resources and by strengthening connections between academic units. According to Prof. AlBreiki, the United Arab Emirates University (UAEU) is now driving interdisciplinary education by dismantling its traditional academic units. Their colleges are going through a process of restructuring, where new interdisciplinary programs are under discussion and planning. With some undergraduate programs suspended, due to relatively low enrolment, the UAEU will focus more on graduate programs that can contribute to the national economy and knowledge creation.

Students of the Indian Institute of Technology Bombay (IITB) are encouraged to expand their learning beyond classrooms. Prof. Chaudhuri believed that this is especially important for undergraduate education, "because graduate education automatically involves research and knowledge development." The undergraduate student body are provided with various research opportunities from the second year onwards, including 24/7 access to makeup spaces and labs and additional credits for research work.

Dr. Kusumayati believed that interdisciplinary collaboration is the only way to solve interconnected problems and improve resilience against crises as large as the COVID-19 pandemic. Under the national education program "Emancipated Learning", Universitas Indonesia now encourages students to learn outside their programs for a maximum of three semesters, either from UI, other universities, or the industry. "When they [students] are doing an independent project or developing a new business, they have to work together with colleagues from other disciplines and learn from them," said Dr. Kusumayati.

Prof. Tin Maung Tun agreed that interdisciplinary research is essential to finding solutions to new problems and grand challenges. This means that the university curriculum will have to change in order to meet such demands. He also stressed the importance of creating an institutional culture that encourages innovation and collaboration.



Panelists also elaborated on the importance of building trusting. reciprocal, and enduring relationships with other universities and organizations. As many universities are facing budget cuts, Prof. AlBreiki suggested that universities could form a network that allows students to fulfill part of their program requirements by taking courses from other universities as a way to deal with the financial challenge. According to Dr. Kusumayati, the program of "Emancipated Learning" has greatly encouraged Indonesian universities to seek collaboration with many kinds of stakeholders. "We want to send our students into the field, industry, and research institutions," she said. By providing knowledge and technology to these partners, a university can gain additional support for its education and research. Prof. Chaudhuri also supported the university-industry partnership, emphasizing that higher education institutions in developing countries like India have the responsibility to support their industry with their learning.

While the universities gain support and benefits from such a network, they are also giving back and sharing what others need. For example, IITB works with local governments to solve water and power problems in rural areas. It has also joined the National Program on Technology Enhanced Learning to provide free quality education to anyone interested in learning from the IITs. "We will have to see that what we do makes an impact on the life of the common people on the street," commented Prof. Chaudhuri. In a similar spirit, Universitas Indonesia assists younger and/or smaller universities in terms of their curriculum development and university management. Dr. Kusumayati added that the university is also expanding its courses to students from other universities under the "Emancipated Learning" program.

Additionally, this session also addressed resource allocation for the arts and social sciences, the balance between long-term educational goals and short-term difficulties and concerns, and ways to minimize the digital divide during the pandemic.

During his concluding remarks, Prof. Chow emphasized that building an integrated education and research ecosystem is important not only for an institution itself, but also for the whole community. He hoped that AUA will lead the joint effort to "raise the entire Asian education community to a different level."

### Plenary Session Embracing Asian Diversity for a Shared Future: Mission of Universities in Fostering a Community of Life for People and Nature

The plenary session of the Asian Universities Alliance (AUA) Presidents Forum 2022 was held on April 22, marking the fifth anniversary of the establishment of the alliance. The theme of this year's forum was "Embracing Asian Diversity for a Shared Future: Mission of Universities in Fostering a Community of Life for People and Nature."

Huai Jinpeng, China's Minister of Education, and Ban Ki-moon, the 8th Secretary-General of the United Nations and Chairman of the Boao Forum for Asia, delivered remarks as the guests of honor at the forum, attended by leaders and representatives of all the 15 AUA member universities and other distinguished guests.

Minister Huai extended congratulations on behalf of his ministry to AUA on its fifth anniversary and remarked that the establishment of the alliance by distinguished universities from different Asian countries and regions reflected the general trend of common development and win-win cooperation in Asian higher education. He urged AUA members to promote regional connections of higher education through digitalization, to deepen the pragmatic cooperation between universities by focusing on talent cultivation and scientific research and innovation, and to promote communication between peoples and appreciation to diverse cultures. He said he was hopeful that AUA would make greater contributions to jointly addressing regional and global challenges, promoting the common welfare of Asian people, and advancing the building of a community with a shared future for mankind.

Ban Ki-moon congratulated AUA on its fifth anniversary, saying, since 2017, AUA has served as a robust platform for regional collaboration, partnership, and dialogue. He called on AUA to scale up its cooperative regional efforts to help forge tangible progress on the UN's development and climate goals. "Your role is extremely important, as we need to ensure that the UN Global Goals are local business, throughout Asia and beyond. With your elevated efforts, I am confident that we can construct a more healthy, sustainable, peaceful, and prosperous world for all," he said.

Carrie Lam Cheng Yuet-ngor, Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, China, Prof. Dr. Anek Laothamatas, Thailand's Minister of Higher Education, Science, Research, and Innovation, and Dr. Nyunt Phy, Myanmar's Union Minister for Education, sent congratulatory messages on AUA's fifth anniversary, which were read out respectively by Wei Shyy, President of The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, Bundhit Eua-arporn, President of Chulalongkorn University, and Tin Maung Tun, Rector of the University of Yangon at the forum.

With each of us sharing a unique set of knowledge and experiences, I am confident that we will be able to continue collectively tackling our common challenges and building a brighter future for all," he said.

Tsinghua University President Wang Xiqin, on behalf of the entire AUA community, presented a token of appreciation to Professor Qiu in recognition of his distinguished leadership during his time as AUA Founding President. Last month, Professor Wang Xiqin was appointed President of Tsinghua University, making him also AUA President. President Wang Xiqin said that he is honored to serve as the new President of AUA and he looks forward to working closely with all the AUA members to enhance AUA's unique contribution to building a shared future for Asia and beyond.

The forum held online was moderated by Yang Bin, Provost and Vice President of Tsinghua University. Eight leaders of other AUA member universities delivered their remarks at the forum. Ghaleb AlHadrami AlBreiki, Acting Vice Chancellor of United Arab Emirates University, Bundhit Eua-arporn, President of Chulalongkorn University, and OH Se-Jung, President of Seoul National University highlighted that higher education was experiencing important paradigm shifts due to global challenges. AUA has been providing a unique space and platform for innovative, multilateral and institutional collaborations among flagship universities of Asia, leading the development of new research and strengthening intercultural understandings. It was an excellent example of leveraging international collaboration to advance the Sustainable Development Goals, while also reinventing the roles of universities.

Subhasis Chaudhuri, Director of the Indian Institute of Technology Bombay, H. D. Karunaratne, Vice Chancellor of the University of Colombo, and Wei Shyy, President of The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology emphasized that Asia is a region with diverse and rich cultural heritage. In the era of global Asia, it is significant to build a closer bond with a shared future among Asian universities. AUA has an important role to play in cultivating the spirit of collaboration and respect among young people and future talents in Asia. Student exchange programs and credit transfer among member universities can be further encouraged in the future.

Shigeo Katsu, President of Nazarbayev University and Tin Maung Tun, Rector of the University of Yangon said that AUA has made great strides in the past five years and has become a place to share best practices, which benefited all member universities. They stated that they would continue to deepen the collaborations in higher education to address regional and global challenges and promote a shared future for humanity.
